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## MIDWAY SCHOOL BOARD MEETING

MONDAY FEBRUARY 8, 2021  
5:00 P.M.

The regular board meeting of the Midway School Board was held on Monday, February 8, 2021 at 5:00 P.M. in the High School Library.

The meeting was called to order by President Brian Schanilec and roll call was taken with the following members present: Brian, Brad Becker, Chad Thorvilson, Kelly Moen-SnoBeck, and Jared Peterka. Chad and Kelly attended the meeting via ZOOM.

Chad made a motion to approve the minutes from the previous board meeting from January 11, 2021. Jared seconded. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

Brad made a motion to approve the Business Managers report. Chad seconded. Motion carried by unanimous vote. Brad made a motion to approve the January 2021 bills for payment. This includes check numbers 13685-13739 for the General Fund and check numbers 16125-16132 for the Activity Fund. Jared seconded. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

Chad seconded. Motion carried by unanimous vote. Jared made a motion to set the school board election for June 8, 2021 at the Midway Public School in the High School Library. The Gilby and Forest River seats are on the ballot this year.

## Booster Seat Basics

### What to know to keep your big kids safe while on the go.

It seems like only yesterday that your little bundle of joy was snuggled into their infant car seat, coming home for the first time. Now they're going on their own adventures, learning about the world and officially too old for "baby stuff."

#### To Boost or Not To Boost?

Belt-positioning boosters are for older children who have outgrown their forward-facing harnessed seat. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), it is best for children to continue to use a forward-facing car seat with a harness and top tether in the back seat as long as possible.



#### Factors to consider when determining if your child is ready for a booster seat:



Your child reaches the top weight or height allowed for their forward-facing seat with a harness. (These limits are listed on the seat and also included in the seat's user guide.)



Your child's shoulders are above the top harness slots in their forward-facing seat.



Your child's ears have reached the top of their forward-facing seat.



Your child meets the age and size requirements of the booster seat.



Your child meets the requirements of your state laws regarding booster seat use.



Your child's maturity level - if your child is a wiggler or sleeps frequently in the vehicle, he may not be ready for a booster seat.

**Did You Know?** Children seated in a booster seat in the back seat of the car are 45% less likely to be injured in a crash than children using a seat belt alone.

**Belt-Positioning Boosters** are designed to "boost" the child up so that the vehicle seat belt is positioned correctly.



The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) recommends all children whose weight or height is above the forward-facing limit for their car safety seat should use a belt-positioning booster seat until the vehicle lap and shoulder seat belt fits properly, typically when they have reached 4 feet 9 inches in height and are between 8 and 12 years old.



North Dakota law states that all children must be in a child restraint until they are 4'9" tall, or at least age 8, whichever comes first.

#### When To Switch To The Vehicle Seat Belt

To be able to fit an adult seat belt, a child must:

- Be tall enough to sit without slouching,
- Keep his/her back and buttocks against the vehicle seat,
- Keep his/her knees completely bent over the front edge of the vehicle seat,
- Keep his/her feet flat on the floor,
- Be able to stay comfortably seated this way, and
- The vehicle seat belt must be positioned correctly across the child's hips and shoulder/middle of the chest.
